We are most grateful to Allan Wright for conducting such a meaningful parish mission this past week. Many souls were nourished by his thoughtful words. May the fruits of this mission bear fruit in our hearts this Lent and beyond. We also wish to thank all volunteers who helped make this mission possible, particularly Kathy Vojta. She applied for the diocesan grant to underwrite the mission, secured the presenter, organized the meals and the liturgies and oversaw all of the details in both our parishes for the three-day mission. Now, let's make this the best Lent ever!

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence from meat. All Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Fasting prescribes that only one full meal be taken. Two smaller meals may be taken to maintain strength, but these taken should not equal another full meal. Fasting obliges from the 18th to the 59th birthday. Abstinence forbids the eating of meat. Abstinence obliges from the 14th birthday on.

Easter Duty: All Catholics have the serious obligation to make a worthy Confession and receive the Holy Eucharist during Paschal Time which runs from the beginning of holy Lent through Pentecost. Please do not neglect this.

Consider attending weekday Mass during Lent, or at least on the penitential days of Wednesday and Friday, during this holy season.

For the season of Lent, a new Mass setting will be used entitled "*Missa Jubilate Deo*" for the parts of the Mass sung in Latin.
