✠ Fourth Sunday of Lent ♦ March 15, 2026 ✠

Praised be Jesus Christ! Now and forever. Amen.

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally known as *Laetare* Sunday, so-called from the first word of the antiphon at the Introit. *Laetare*, (“Rejoice”), taken from the Latin translation of Isaiah 66:10-11, sets a tone of joyful anticipation of the Easter mystery, as does the permitted use of rose-colored vestments. *You are invited to wear pink colored clothing to mass this weekend!*

In the dioceses of the United States, crosses in the church may be covered from the conclusion of the Mass for the Saturday of the Fourth Week of Lent until the end of the Celebration of the Lord’s Passion on Good Friday. Images in the church may be covered from the conclusion of the Mass for the Saturday of the Fourth Week of Lent until the beginning of the Easter Vigil. We shall observe this ancient custom in our churches to focus our senses on the Lenten liturgy and instill a longing for the festive celebration of Our Lord’s Resurrection.

A solemn blessing and procession of palms will be held prior to the 10:30 am Mass at SH church on Palm Sunday, March 29. The faithful are asked to gather at the school on Sunday, March 29, by 10:30 am. The palms will be blessed there, and all will process into the church for Mass. The choir will lead us in song as we process through the rectory driveway, up the ramp and into the church. Palms will also be blessed in a simple ritual and distributed at all Masses in both of our parishes that weekend.

On Good Friday, our parishes will take up the annual collection for the Holy Land. We ask you to be generous. Your financial contribution will support the works of the Catholic Church in the Middle East and to protect the Holy Places and Christian shrines.

Stations of the Cross will be prayed in common each Friday evening throughout Lent at 7 p.m. You are invited to walk with Our Lord along the Way of Sorrows. The Stations schedule is as follows: Mar. 20 (SM), Mar. 27 (SH), Apr. 3 (SM).

THE LIGHT IS ON FOR YOU: on Mondays of Lent, Confessions will be heard in church from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. on these dates: Mar. 16 (SH), 23 (SM). The deanery penance service will be on March 30, 6:30pm at St. John the Evangelist Church, Pittston.

All Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Abstinence obliges from the 14th birthday on.

Consider attending weekday Mass during Lent, or at least on the penitential days of Wednesday and Friday, during this holy season.

Easter Duty: All Catholics have the serious obligation to make a worthy Confession and receive the Holy Eucharist during Paschal Time which runs from the beginning of holy Lent through Pentecost. Please do not neglect this.

SH parish office will be closed Wednesday, Mar. 18 to Friday, Mar. 20. The office will reopen on Monday, Mar. 23 at 8:30am.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society is an international voluntary organization in the Catholic Church, founded in 1833 for the sanctification of its members by personal service of the poor. Started by Frédéric Ozanam and Emmanuel-Joseph Bailly de Surcy and named after Vincent de Paul, the organization is part of the global Vincentian Family of Catholic organizations. Innumerable Catholic pastors have established this group in their parishes to offer material help to the poor or needy. There are a great variety of outreach programs sponsored by parish groups, addressing local needs for social services and even pro-life advocacy work. The national headquarters is in St. Louis, Missouri. Group members are called “Vincentians.” With nearly 90,000 Vincentian volunteers serving their communities, today’s Society of St. Vincent de Paul works in 4,428 parish-based groups across the United States. Fr. Petro is now establishing a St. Vincent de Paul Society in Queen of the Apostles Parish. Elevating the former Social Concerns/Pro-Life Ministry to this new identity will bring a renewal of spirituality and accountability to the group. The SM St. Vincent de Paul Society will continue all the good work already begun, such as the Thanksgiving food baskets, the Christmas Giving Tree, the Easter food baskets, the pro-life baby shower, carnation sale and baby bottle campaign. Donations placed in the parish poor box located in the SM narthex are deposited directly into the St. Vincent de Paul Society checking account and will be used exclusively for the charitable needs of our parish. Each September a collection envelope appears in the envelope packs and all money collected also is deposited into their account. Individuals may make monetary donations at any time to SVDP by contacting the parish office. Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish also has a St. Vincent de Paul Society that operates in a similar manner but needs active membership.
